Psychotherapeutic Consultation for Migrants

The psychotherapeutic consultation service for migrants (CPM) offers specialised psychotherapeutic and psychiatric help to people suffering from the psychological consequences of their migratory experience and/or of war, torture or any form of collective violence. It provides three consultation centres, in Lausanne, Vevey and Yverdon-les-Bains.

The CPM is one of four consultation services in Switzerland for victims of torture and war (CTG) supported by the Red Cross. It is a member of the French-speaking network for the healthcare and support of victims of torture and political violence living in exile (RESEDA) and of the European Network of Rehabilitation Centres for Survivors of Torture.

Its multidisciplinary teams (psychologists, psychiatrists, physiotherapists) offer: individual, couples, family or group therapies, with the help of community interpreters where necessary; counselling and liaison consultations; training and supervisory activities, both internal and external; psychosocial support in partnership with Appartenances' other sectors.

Social spaces

The social spaces at Appartenances provide a personalised welcome to migrants and their children living in situations of social, economic, psychological or physical insecurity. Teams of professionals, both salaried staff and volunteers, provide a range of individual and collective activities aimed at facilitating the process of reciprocal integration within Swiss society. These include training courses, community meetings and support groups.

Centre Femmes – Lausanne

Le Centre Femmes (Women's Centre) is a place where migrant women, whose living conditions are insecure or unstable, can come and meet or participate in training activities, accompanied by their preschool aged children. The activities proposed by the centre are aimed at allowing each participant to increase her power of action over her own life and in the context of her family and social environment. Through learning and exchanges with other women, participants strengthen their skills and capacities, acquire new knowledge and know-how and develop greater selfconfidence, all of which contribute to the integration process.

Le Centre Femmes offers: a reception and social orientation, French and sewing courses, community meetings, ad-hoc activities, outings and visits. A child-care centre is available for participants' children.

Espace Mozaïk – Lausanne

Situated in the heart of the city of Lausanne, *l'Espace Mozaïk* provides a personalised reception service to migrants with precarious living conditions. It is a space for socialisation, integration and reconstruction of identity, which aims at preventing and fighting against psychosocial insecurity. Its team provides training, exchange and support activities, aimed at facilitating the construction of social bonds. The fundamental values of Espace Mozaïk are sharing, reciprocity, respect and generosity between all participants.

L'Espace Mozaïk offers: a reception and social advice service, beginners and intermediate French language workshops, psychosocial support, sociocultural activities.

Espace Femmes Riviera - Vevey

L'Espace Femmes Riviera (Women's Space Riviera) provides a space for socialising and training for migrant women with precarious living conditions in the Riviera and Chablais regions of the Canton of Vaud, as well as for their preschool aged children. Its main objective is to allow migrant women to acquire the tools necessary for developing their autonomy, by means of the association's internal activities or by orienting them towards other partners in the local network. Its approach places value on participants' personal resources, in order to provide them with the opportunity of regaining self-confidence, acquiring new skills and creating social bonds.

L'Espace Femmes Riviera offers: reception service, social support, French language and basic literacy courses, community meetings, outings and visits. A child-care centre is available for participants' children.

Espace Femmes Yverdon - Yverdon-les-Bains

L'Espace Femmes Yverdon (Women's Space Yverdon) proposes a range of workshops to migrant women and their children, aimed at facilitating exchanges and intercultural dialogue in a convivial and open setting. These workshops, meetings and outings provide the women with an opportunity for practising French, immersing themselves in local culture and getting to know the town of Yverdon-les-Bains. Particular attention is paid to the enhancement of participants' resources, to the development of their various means of expression and to their wellbeing.

L'Espace Femmes Yverdon offers: socialisation and outings, community meals, introduction to movement, gardening workshop, a mother and child workshop and an expression workshop for children.

Community interpreting

The Intermedia service at Appartenances trains, employs and supervises community interpreters who intervene on request to facilitate work in institutional settings, notably in the areas of education, social work and health in the Canton of Vaud. These interpreters facilitate mutual understanding between interlocutors from different languages and cultural backgrounds. Each interpreter has received initial certified training — Swiss Certificate or Federal Diploma in community interpreting — as well as in-service training and supervision.

The objectives of the Community interpreting sector are: to allow migrants the possibility of expressing themselves in their mother tongue and thus improve their access to existing services; to provide both interpreters and other professionals with the opportunity to train and establish a dynamic of regular exchanges; to work for the recognition of the professional status of community interpreters.

Training

Appartenances offers a broad range of in-service training programmes around issues linked to migration, interculturality and organised violence. The transdisciplinary methodology of these training programmes promotes reflection on professional practice as well as drawing parallels with personal experiences. Our courses target professionals from the fields of education, health care, social work and community interpreting, volunteers working in the association sector and anyone with an interest in these issues.

The Training service publishes a catalogue of courses, seminars and conferences (order a copy or consult it on our website www.appartenances.ch), as well as made to measure training programme, aimed at meeting the specific needs of institutions or associations.
